Exclusively imported from Australia by Australian Brushwood USA, it is made from the native *Melaleuca Uncinata*, and has been used for fencing in Australia for over 100 years. Australian Brushwood panels are a unique, new, creative, “green” alternative to the traditional fencing and specialty landscape marketplace. *Melaleuca Uncinata* bushes are harvested to preserve the plants’ roots so crops are environmentally responsible: re-planting and cultivation efforts help sustain natural resources in Australia, providing solutions to salinity levels, wind erosion, creating wildlife habitats and reversing land degradation. Strong, secure, durable, Australian Brushwood panels are naturally pest & insect resistant, and their thick density provides protection from sun, wind and sound. A standard full panel measures approx. 45” wide x 68” tall x an-inch-and-a-half

thick. Each panel weighs approximately 75 lbs. Australian Brushwood, grown and manufactured into panels in Australia, is aesthetically pleasing with a long maintenance-free life span of approximately 40+ years. Panels can be framed using standard size timber; (4x4 posts; 2x4 cross members, 1x2 trim); or by using the traditional Australian method, all-brushwood look, with steel framing hidden by brushwood roll tops and concrete curb footing. Because Australian Brushwood is custom installed, it becomes a naturally tailored part of each unique design environment. These beautiful new panels may also be cut to fit various size requirements, such as block wall height extension toppers. A stylish, sensible solution for a variety of needs: sound diffusion, hot tub enclosures, water features, gazebos, area dividers. Installation instructions are available by request.
